EASTER VIGIL

This Holy Week has certainly been different, more homely, more in family, in community. That time that we "do not always have" of being together, of sharing, of saying thank you, I love you or forgiveness, of evaluating our lives, of dreaming and projecting ourselves together, of meeting with God and with those who suffer.

In the midst of all the pain and fear of the pandemic, we have much to be thankful for and celebrate.

We want to invite you on this night of vigil, to leave the "screens" a little and to be like spectators and "gather", to meet in communion of prayer, wherever we are.

There is much to celebrate! It is the hope that death does not have the last word, but that life triumphs, truth stands up and justice sings victory! **THIS IS THE DAY WHEN EVERYTHING STARTS AGAIN**, when we can hold hands and celebrate that we are still together, that God is great and that his love is infinite.

We begin by lighting the Paschal Candle and holding hands we sing the Easter Proclamation.

Every Easter is an opportunity to renew faith, hope and love.

According to the Apostle Paul, through Baptism the believer participates in the death of Christ; he is buried and rises with Him: "Do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too might live a new life". The baptized have "clothed themselves with Christ". Through the Holy Spirit, Baptism is a bath that purifies, sanctifies and justifies.

(Catechism, No. 1227)

Let us thus renew our baptismal promises, our commitment to God and to our neighbors:

an evening sacrifice of praise,
this gift from your most holy Church.

But now we know the praises of this pillar,
which glowing fire ignites for God's honor,
a fire into many flames divided,
yet never dimmed by sharing of its light,
for it is fed by melting wax,
drawn out by mother bees
to build a torch so precious.

O truly blessed night,
when thing of heaven are wed to those of earth,
and divine to the human.

Therefore, O Lord,
we pray you that this candle,
hallowed to the honor of your name,
may persevere undimmed,
to overcome the darkness of this night,
Receive it as a pleasing fragrance,
and let it mingle with the lights of heaven.
May this flame be found still burning
by the Morning Star:
the one Morning Star who never sets,
Christ your Son,
who, coming back from death's domain,
has shed his peaceful light on humanity,
and lives and reigns for ever and ever.

Presiding person:

(we answer I do to each question)

Do you reject Satan: sin, as a denial of God; evil, as a sign of sin in the world; error, as a blurring of the truth; violence, as contrary to charity; selfishness, as a lack of testimony of love?

R: I do.

Presiding person:

Do you reject all his works, all sin: envy and hatred; laziness and indifference; cowardice and insecurities; sadness and distrust; injustice and favouritism; materialism and sensuality; lack of faith, hope and charity?

R: I do.

Presiding person:

Do you reject all his empty show: to believe yourself better or superior; to be very sure of yourself; to believe that you are already converted and that the sinner is someone else; to stay in things, means, institutions, methods, regulations, and not go to God?

R: I do.

(requests can be added on a voluntary basis)

All are sprinkled with holy water. A song may be listened.



Presiding person:

(we answer I do to each question)

Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth?

R: I do.

Presiding person:

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified, died, and was buried, rose from the dead, and is now seated at the right hand of the Father?

R: I do.

Presiding person:

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting?

R: I do.

(prayers can be added on a voluntary basis)

Presiding person:

And may almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit and bestowed on us forgiveness of our sins, keep us by his grace, in Christ Jesus our Lord, for eternal life.

R. Amen.

Reading from the Gospel:

But Mary stayed outside the tomb weeping. And as she wept, she bent over into the tomb and saw two angels in white sitting there, one at the head and one at the feet where the body of Jesus had been. And they said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken my Lord, and I don't know where they laid him." When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus there, but did not know it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" She thought it was the gardener and said to him, "Sir, if you carried him away, tell me where you laid him, and I will take him." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" But go to my brothers and tell them, 'I am going to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" We make silence.

Then we raise our thanksgiving and prayer for the whole Church.

What is the hope that Easter, the Risen One, gives me in my life, in the life of the community, to the whole Church?

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The true Risen Ones, those of flesh and blood, have bodies that are sensitive to the crucified of the world because they remember their own redeemed cross, given to those who constantly prowl the borders of death, because they remember the dark time of their own tombs. They cannot turn their eyes and their flesh away from the crucified, they know how to see in them the image of God, the profaned body of the Son and the Father at his side, because they recognize themselves in this way, wounded and healed.

Our whole being is transformed by God's embrace and is sent out to evangelize. The death, the Easter, the Resurrection of our body in loving service to others, will tell the truth about God in us: our healing and clean relationships will reveal the gratitude that we are liberated in that same capacity to liberate, to heal, to forgive, to love. The Resurrection is only credible when our lives reveal love. It is and will be credible only when we are able to look into each other's eyes, to caress each other and to tell each other:

(Phrases can be read spontaneously, alternating moments of silence)

I no longer belong to myself, but I am yours; because I love you, dispose of my life, of my health, my rest, and of all that I am and have. (MR III,2)

As our spiritual union is now a consummated fact, there is no need to insist on the matter of love: you love me, I love you, and love is works. (MR 1,19)

You know that I love you. And now that you are asking me this question, my Daughter, receive again an act of love. Yes, I love you, and I love you because you have stolen my heart.

(MR IV,2)

Oh, what happiness is mine! I have found you now. I love you; you know that: the least I can offer you is my life, to return your love. (MR III,2).



I have formed you according to my love, you are the object of my love, I love you with the love which I love myself, you are mine, all mine, and I will not leave you. –If you do not leave me, I will not be lost.

–I come to tell you just one word. –Say it, my Beloved, speak, I am listening attentively to your voice. –I love you. –I am happy. This is what I wanted to hear from your mouth. –Yes, I love you, and you believe it, and because you believe it, so it is. –Unhappy me if you did not love me, unfortunate would I be if I did not believe it! MR 4,5

Because I love you, I searched for you in service as means of pleasing you. You know that I love you. How is it possible to cease loving you when I know you? You have revealed yourself to me, you show your love to me; and my heart, drawn by that indomitable passion wants to serve you and to please you. –Well, if you love me, why do you want to leave me? If you love me you will have sorrows in the measure of your love; accept me as your companion in sorrows. Do you want an effective remedy for all your ills? (MR 9,7)



–I always see you anew, and the more I look at you the more beautiful I find you, the more I love you, the lovelier and more loveable I see you; for me you are so new that every day seems to me as if it is the first day that I see, love and possess you. MR 9,35
